If you're looking to include in-person assessment information in your Moodle course, there are a few tools that can help you with this.

First, the page tool. It appears as a block on the main course page in Moodle. You have the option to provide some brief information, such as context about what this page contains, that would appear on the main course page. Then, when students click on the title of the page, they get taken to the secondary space where the full assessment details would go. Here you can include things such as text, hyperlinks, or embedded media.

Second, is the text and media area. As you can see, whatever you put in this area displays right on the main course page. In this example, I included a heading and paragraph text to give you a sense of what both options appear as. So, as you can see, if you have a lot of information, then this can take up a lot of space on the main course page. It is something to be considerate of depending on what kind of information you have to share.

Finally, we have the file tool. It appears quite similarly as the page does but it's meant for attaching and presenting a file. Just like the page tool, you can add some context for the main course page if you'd like. Then, when students click on the title of the file, they get taken to the file itself depending on what format it is. In this case, it was a PDF, so it opens very easily in the browser. Pdf is a nice accessible file because it is very easy to open across various devices.

In summary, these are three tools you can use to include information about in-person assessments in your Moodle course, depending on how much information you have and how you want to display it.
